OBJECTIVE

The objective of the CFMA scholarship is to enable full-time students interested in Finance and Accounting to pursue their education in the subject.

REQUIREMENTS

The scholarship has multiple requirements. All applicants are expected to meet all of the below stated requirements:

1. Enroll in an eligible Washington College or University as a full-time student.
2. Enroll in either a Bachelors or advanced degree program in finance and/or accounting or have declared finance/accounting major.
3. Demonstrate a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
4. Submit a complete CFMA Scholarship Application.
5. Submit a 300 word essay that demonstrates the applicant's relationship to the Construction Industry and/or Emerging Issues in the Construction Industry.
6. Submit current transcripts from the Colleges or Universities attended thus far.
7. Submit 2 letters of recommendations, with one academic and one from the business community (letters cannot be from a member of the applicant's immediate family).

APPLICATION DEADLINE & ADDRESS

All application materials, including the required application, transcripts, Letters of Recommendations and essay must be received by the CFMA on or before **March 12, 2010**.

REVIEW AND AWARD

Scholarships up to the amount of \$2,000 will be announced in April 2010 and awarded in time for the Fall quarter 2010. Applicants may be required to attend a live interview prior to award.

The CFMA South Sound Chapter includes representatives from Construction Firms, Public Accounting Firms, Insurance Firms and various construction related partners in the South Sound area, The Chapter's Scholarship Committee will award all scholarships based upon the above stated criteria.
